

Bill Briggs, in "Faith Through Works," talks about the necessity of mission work in the church to not only spread God's love but to give church members a way to make their faith active, not passive. He

discusses reasons many mission projects fail - one is that the members themselves don't have interests in projects designed by clergy or church officers. The solution one New Hampshire church found was to set up core groups according to actual interests of the members. These groups determined needs in the community and abroad, and decided what they felt might be offered to solve the problems. He covers how the groups proceeded. Some of their seven projects were aiding refugees, working with the poor in Guatemala, helping the homeless, and working to help remove the loneliness of elderly folks in isolation at home, in assisted living or nursing homes.

This is not a new book, but the material is still relevant today.

If you are studying a passage in the New Testament, a good choice for commentary help is N. T. Wright's series, "The Bible for Everyone." Wright includes the scripture verses, and, using examples, helps the reader learn what the passage meant when written and what it should mean today. His series is on the shelves next to the library door to the hallway. Note that he has more than one volume for some books and others are grouped by the writer or the location.


