Prepare The Way Of The Lord

Advent marks the beginning of the church calendar year and is a season of preparation. In Advent we prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ. Our Advent theme this year is “Jesus Christ the Light of the World” and you will see decorations in the church that highlight this theme. You might consider having an Advent Candle wreath at your dinner table and each day of December light a candle as a ritual to welcome the light of the world into your life.

In Advent, which begins on Sunday, Nov. 27, we prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ into the world as an infant and we also prepare for Jesus Christ’s return—his coming again to the world. As the calendar advances closer to Christmas Day we are reminded of the miracle of the Christ Child, that God became human in the person of Jesus, born as a baby to Mary and Joseph. The familiar scripture stories celebrate the angels proclaiming glory to God, Joseph and Mary welcoming their firstborn in a lowly manger, the shepherds coming to the manger and finding the Christ child, and the Wise Men arriving to give homage to the newborn King. As we prepare our homes to celebrate Christmas may we also prepare our hearts to welcome God being with us in Jesus Christ.

As Christians, we know that Advent is also a preparation for Jesus coming again. In John 14:1-8 Jesus promised his disciples that he would be leaving them and then he would come again. Jesus didn’t tell his disciples when he would return and he didn’t even know himself. So Advent is a time of preparation so that we are ready whenever Jesus returns. We prepare by reaffirming our calling as disciples to follow him as our Lord and Savior.

Our preparation during Advent is a personal journey as well. I encourage you to make worship, Bible study, prayer, and meditation part of your personal journey of faith this Advent. When we worship together on Sundays and Christmas Eve we come together as the Body of Christ to give praise to God for God’s love. God loves us so much that he sent his Son to demonstrate his love. Take time this Advent to read the gospel of John. If you read a chapter a day during

Advent you will finish before Christmas. Hear the expression of God’s love in Christ’s ministry. Take time to pray and meditate on your own each day. Remember that prayer is not talking to God, it is being in a conversation with God. That conversation includes both talking and listening to God. Meditate on what you have experienced in worship, read in the Bible and heard in your prayer time with God. This will prepare you for the coming of Christ not just into the world, but into your world, into your life.

Mark 1:3, “Prepare ye the way of the Lord.” As we enter Advent and arrive at Christmas I wish God’s blessing and peace on you as our Lord and Savior comes into our lives.

Plans To Welcome Guests to Our Mission Center

After over two years of meals-only service to the homeless families with children enrolled in the Family Promise program, it's time for area congregations to begin housing families onsite. The Board of Directors of Family Promise, currently headed by Rev. Bob Garrard, is hard at work to segue from the current arrangement, (i.e., housing families at Natalie House (the house purchased several months ago), to a model which involves congregations housing families until parent/s are ready to do their own childcare, meal prep, and cleaning chores. At that point, they will move to Natalie House, and then when they are ready to 'graduate,' they will move to their own apartments. Our hope is that this model, involving an extra step in the progression from congregation support to apartment living, will provide the gradual easing of structure that will allow families to develop increased self-discipline which will help them follow schedules, maintain the discipline of orderly habits, and understand they have the power to maintain an orderly life.

Pre-pandemic, ten congregations were sharing hosting responsibilities. At this point, eight of those congregations, including ours, have plans to resume hosting. The Board is working on developing a schedule which will still provide a ten-week rotation with Family Promise itself assuming responsibility to use at least two

weeks of each rotation for real-life experience in budgeting and food preparation. The process of integrating a new schedule into the current off-site program is challenging, but all recognize its importance and feel that it will lead to even better long-term success for the families we help.

Our current estimate is that we will be ready to host families in late December or January. We are currently focusing on prepping the Mission Center for guests and waiting for the camera monitoring system to be installed. In the meantime, we are most grateful to Deluxe Laundry Service on South Greeley Highway (formerly Dirty Duds Laundromat) for their in-kind donation of half the sanitizing service for our bed linens after each rotation and to Quality Electric for working with Capital Protective Services to provide alerts when egress windows or exit doors are opened during overnight stays.

We appreciate the tremendous support from our congregation during these past couple of years, when we continued to provide meals while families were housed off-site! We have a cadre of dedicated cooking volunteers who showed their caring nature with delicious meals. Now we need to rebuild our volunteer base for dinner hosts to be with families from 5 to 8 p.m. on host nights, for Saturday hosts to work in 3-hour shifts if families are planning on being at church during the day, and for overnight hosts, who will arrive at 8 p.m. and leave at 7 a.m. the next morning (or at an earlier time if needed). Please contact Greta Morrow (421-3436) or Linda Woodard (287-4796) if you would like to join our list of possible volunteers for hosting, cooking, or spending the night. A one-week rotation requires about 40 volunteers, so we need your help and will very much appreciate having you as an ally!

September 2022 Mission Trip to Dominican Republic

Another Living Water International mission was accomplished September 17-24 by congregation members. This time in the Dominican Republic [DR], a large island country located in the Greater Antilles of the Caribbean Sea. Tom Muhlbach, Norm Soden, Don Skoumal, Joe Dougherty, Allen Bird, Kevin Boyce, Stan Clapp, Theresa Hopper, and Matt (from Houston TX) flew to Santiago, DR via Miami FL and then embarked by van for a 3-hour tour to Dajabon, a city situated on the border of DR and Haiti.

The original plan was to drill a well in Haiti but the social-political turmoil present in that country kept us in the DR. The 1st Presbyterian team completed water system rehabilitation projects (a new pipeline bypass, a tank valve repair, installing a new pressure relief valve, and painting a storage tank) in the villages of Los Arroyos and Clavallina outside Dajabon.

Our merry band of workers were well received by local residents who also provided very tasty local dishes for our midday meals. All went swimmingly until Tom became ill and had to stay hospitalized in Santiago for about 2 weeks after the team's departure. Tom has since returned to Cheyenne, and is still being treated.



Let's help church workers and students!

This is the time of year we focus on all the blessings we have and honor the perfect gift of Christ's birth by giving to those who are important in our lives. Our Christmas Joy Offering, taken this year on December 18, gives us a chance to extend our gift list beyond those close to us and donate to assist pastors and other church workers in need as well as students who need help to attend Presbyterian-related schools and colleges.

For example, your donation could help a pastor who has worked his entire career helping rural congregations with limited budgets and then has a stroke after his retirement. That was the case with Rev. Whitfield of Indiana. After his stroke, he and his wife received immediate help from an Emergency Assistance Grant and then long-term monthly housing supplements for retirees receiving home health care. If you would like to ensure that one of our retired pastors would receive such help, please consider donating to the Christmas Joy Offering this year.

A second half of your donation will be used to help students attend Presbyterian-related schools and colleges serving communities of color, specifically Menaul School in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville, Texas; and Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

An example of how your donation could help comes from an experience a student named Kyley had at Stillman College. She had enrolled at Stillman with financial help from her grandmother. When her grandmother died, Kyley dropped out of school for lack of funds. It wasn't long, however, before one of her professors connected Kyley with the PC(USA) resources to receive scholarships and loans, even rent assistance. In similar circumstances, your donation could help someone else stay in college and work toward a career.

Please remember that the church will match up to \$2,000 of Christmas Joy Offering donations. Your generosity will make a difference in the life of a church worker or student who needs the financial boost. Be sure to write "Christmas Joy Offering" on the memo line of your check as you join thousands of other Presbyterians in this act of generosity!


