## God's Love

In May, we will be celebrating Mother's day and Pentecost.

On Mother's day we are reminded of the wonderful love we received from our mothers. They carried each of us in their wombs, gave birth to us, and raised us until we could take care of

ourselves. There is a special kind of love that a mother has for her children. We usually speak of God as our "Father", but God is neither male nor female, God does not have a gender. We can and we should also consider God as our "mother". God loves us and protects us like a mother protects her children. When Jesus was looking over Jerusalem, he expressed in Matthew 23 how much he desired to gather the children of God together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings. This loving protection of God is also expressed in Psalm 91, "Under God's wings you will find refuge, God's faithfulness is a shield and a defense."

If you have ever been around animal mothers when they have babies, you know how protective a mother's love can be. It is well known that you do not want to get between a mama bear and her cubs. We are God's children, and the protective love of our mothers is reflective of the love God has for us. As we celebrate Mother's day, may we remember our mother's love and the love that God has for us as a mother.

We will also be celebrating Pentecost on Sunday, May 28. If you read Acts chapter 2, you will hear the story of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples in Jerusalem. It was 50 days after the Resurrection and the disciples were waiting, as Jesus had instructed them, to receive God's power. On Pentecost they were gathered in one place, and the Holy Spirit came upon them. Acts 2:3, "Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit." It was from this event, filled with the Spirit of God, that the disciples journeyed out to the world and spread the good news of Jesus Christ.

It is not surprising that the liturgical color for Pentecost is red, reminding us of the tongues of fire. If you look at the PC(USA) symbol, you see tongues of fire on each side of the cross. On Pentecost Sunday we will have the sanctuary decked out in the color red and encourage you to wear something red.

The Holy Spirit still fills us as disciples, empowering us to share the good news of the Gospel to the world through words and deeds. We share the word of God through our teaching and worship and through our ministry in the community. As we serve people in the world in the name of Jesus, we share God's love. As we celebrate Pentecost, remember you have been touched by the Holy Spirit. You have been blessed with the power and authority of God to share the good news of Jesus Christ with the world.




## First Presbyterian Recognized

The local Historic Preservation Historic Preservation Board Board and the City of Chevenne have selected First Presbyterian Church for the LeClercq Jones award for historic preservation. The award will be presented on Saturday, May 6<sup>th</sup> at 1:00. During the award ceremony, Richard Johnson, Council President, will read a proclamation naming April as Historic Preservation month. The church will also be presented the LeClercq Jones award at this time. Following the presentation, there will be a reception in the new Fellowship Hall. Tours of the church renovation will also be available. The restoration of the church parlor and library will be highlighted on the tours. The congregation is encouraged to attend the presentation on May 6th.

The Historic Preservation Board recognized the work the church did during the renovation to preserve the looks of the original building while adding to the building in a way that complimented the original structure. Using limestone from the original quarry in Indiana, some of the design elements of the original building were also incorporated into the new addition stonework. In making the selection, the Historic Preservation Board looks for exceptional historic preservation efforts through restoration and or maintenance of the structure.

The church worked with The Design Studio, Inc on the project and is pleased with the design of the new addition. Architect Amber Conwell, working with the Capital Building Committee, used input from the congregation on a design that compliments the existing building. The new façade and entrance does that well. The church is honored to receive the LeClercq Jones award honoring its efforts during the renovation project.



This congregation has been behind Day of Giving efforts since the blood and bone marrow registration drive in 2005, the event which turned out to be the precursor to Day of Giving in 2006. Eighteen years later, here I am to ask one thing of every member of our congregation: Choose one of the many ways to give and, on May 11 for the Youth Event after school or May 12 for the all-day event, come out to the Kiwanis Community House in Lions Park and give in that way.

Whether you bring food and personal care items, drop off medical supplies, give blood, donate extra craft supplies, or bring out a couple of packages of new underwear, you will be reaching out to help our neighbors who are sick or in dire financial straits. We really are 'walking the talk' of our faith and giving area agencies a huge infusion of donations that will help carry them through the summer when supplies tend to run low.

The big news this year is that we are partnering with the Fresh Start Program at Habitat for Humanity to help the clients at four of the agencies we support when they can finally move into an unfurnished apartment – but have no money to outfit it. We are asking donors to drop off furniture, housewares, kitchen items, and other items that can help furnish such an apartment. Habitat for Humanity will take these items to their ReStore. Clients at area agencies will receive vouchers for \$250 and then use that 'money' to shop for the necessities, maybe a table and chairs, a sofa, a chest of drawers, a lamp and some pots, pans, and dishes, for example. (Habitat for Humanity cannot accept bedding, mattresses, pillows, and sleeper sofas.)

Thanks to our wonderful congregation for all the ways you have helped Day of Giving grow over the years! I hope to see you at the Kiwanis Community House on May 11 or 12!

#### **Pentecost Offering** May 28 **Celebrating the Power** of the Holy Spirit

As the memory of Easter Sunday and our celebration of Jesus' resurrection is still fresh in our minds, we approach Pentecost, the celebration of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples and thus the beginning of global mission work. It is fitting that in our celebration of the new world and the Holy Spirit among us, we dedicate this offering to helping youth.

We will send 60% of our offering to PC(USA) to be used in their youth programs. They will work toward lowering the drop-out rate among at-risk youth, growing early childhood education programs, helping with Triennium, which our youth have attended several times, and encouraging participation in the Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) Program, among numerous other efforts. The remaining 40% of this offering will stay in our area and go toward improving life for at-risk youth in our area.

Remember that Mission Ministry will match the congregation total donation up to \$2,000, so we have the potential to impact numerous lives with this offering. #### First Family Promise rocheyenne Promise Rotation a Success!

We took a big step forward the week of March 26-April 2 when we had our first Family Promise rotation since the COVID pandemic and inaugurated our new Mission Center. Thanks to our volunteers who brought in delicious meals, ate with the families, hosted until 8 p.m., served as overnight hosts, and helped with our laundry. Things went very smoothly. We coordinators could not have covered those jobs without our additional volunteers, and we send a big thank you to each of you!

Including coordinators, we needed 29 volunteers who logged 168 hours for the week. We began with two families and then Family Promise sent one family to a hotel when one of the children became sick. That left us with one family, a mother and her 3-year-old son. They enjoyed their brand-new sleeping room; the kitchen, where they had nice quarters to enjoy dinner and grab a snack anytime; and the commons area, which offers plenty of room for children to play, sometimes with volunteers or coordinators who acted as role models for the mother, who needed some ideas on how to play with her son.

We understand our rotations will be approximately every 10 weeks, so we will likely be hosting again around the first week in July. If you are interested in volunteering for any of the 'jobs' we need to fill, please reach out to one of us at the numbers listed below! We have a dedicated pool of volunteers but need to increase their numbers so as to avoid burnout for anyone. Jobs include dinner-makers for either entrée and vegetable or salad and dessert, dinner host on weekdays from 5-8 p.m., overnight hosts from 8 p.m. until 7 a.m. or earlier if needed, and 3-hour Saturday shifts are for guests who plan to be at the church between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. We will appreciate your help and think you will enjoy being part of our outreach to homeless families with children!




