Giving Thanks

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for

you." November is the month when we take time to give thanks. We give thanks for the blessings we have received, the blessing we receive from our family and friends, and more importantly, the blessing we receive from God.

The first Thanksgiving was celebrated by the Plymouth colonists from England and the Native American Wampanoag people in October of 1621. It was a time to celebrate the harvest that had just been completed. According to Google, "the event was attended by 90 Native Americans and 53 survivors of the Mayflower." In the Thanksgiving celebration, the Plymouth colonists gave thanks to God for the provisions God provided for their survival and their lives. The Native Americans at the celebration were key to the Colonists' survival that first year.

Today, 400 years later, it is still important for us to take time to give thanks for what God has provided us. God has provided for our physical needs, our relationship needs, and our spiritual needs.

God has provided for our physical needs, food, water, air, and the basic necessities of life. For most of us, we can celebrate that we have our basic needs in abundance. As we give thanks to God for meeting our needs, we realize that there are people in the world who face food and water insecurities. It is not that God hasn't provided

for all people, but the sin and darkness of the world have disrupted the availability of the earth's resources for all people. In our giving thanks, it is a requirement of our faith that we help provide and secure the basic needs of life for all people. Two of the ways we help with this in our ministry are through our extended table collection each Communion Sunday and our supplying food at COMEA.

God has also provided for our relational needs. We are created to live in a relationship with one another.

The first Thanksgiving recognized the blessing the Native Americans were to the Plymouth colonists. As we give thanks this season, let us remember the people that God has put in our lives and the blessing they are to us. Our family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, and the family of faith, our sisters and brothers in Christ who surround us as a family of God's love.

Finally, along with our physical and relational needs, God has provided for our spiritual needs. God sent his son, our Lord and Savior, so that we might fully experience God's love. In the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ,

God has demonstrated his love, grace, and mercy. Through Christ, we have received forgiveness, and in Christ, we are adopted into the family of God. Let us give thanks for God's presence in our lives.

We set aside one day this month to give thanks. Take time daily, every day of this month, and every day of our lives to give thanks. Give thanks to God for meeting our physical, relational, and spiritual needs.

May you have a Happy Thanksgiving.

The heartwarming news with this article is that our congregation members decided to do something about that themselves and responded so generously in support of the Peace and Global Witness Offering that we will indeed be making a difference locally and around the world.

Mission Ministry sends a big thank-you to all who contributed to this offering. You helped bring the peace of Christ to those who will benefit from our donations! Locally, we will send 25% of the offering and its match to Safehouse, which works so hard in Cheyenne to help victims of abuse. We will send this same amount to Presbytery so we can get help to those in need beyond Laramie County. Then, of course, the 50%, plus match, which will go to PC(USA) may go to any of hundreds of projects in the works worldwide.

After World Communion Sunday, the official date of the Peace and Global Witness Offering, we had already received \$800. At the deadline for this newsletter, we had a grand total of \$1,031.50, with donations made by credit card coming in on November 1. In this and our other efforts to facilitate mission work beyond Laramie County, Mission Ministry members often comment on what a generous, loving congregation we have. Happy Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is coming and I always like to have my boys look up Bible verses that have to do with being thankful. So, I decided to do something a little different this year. I have found 10 verses (I know there are a lot more) from the Bible for them. I am going to write them on index cards. I am then going to put the index cards in the center of our dining room table. I will have one child grab a card and read it aloud. I will write the following questions on the board or a piece of paper for the boys to look for in their verse to better understand what it is saying. (Note they will not be able to answer every question with each verse.)

Who is being thankful?

Who are they thankful for? (this will be in every terse)

Why are they thankful?

What are they doing because of their thankfulness? (example: praising)

The boys can answer the questions and write the answers on the cards. After all the verses have been looked up and questions answered, I will have the boys sort their cards between being thankful for/to God and being thankful for others.

Another idea to use these verses is to write the references on leaf cutouts. Then the children can answer the questions on the leaf and then the leaves could be used on a bulletin board.

Thankfulness Bible Verses

2 Samuel 22:50 – Therefore I will give thanks to You, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and sing praises to Your name.

1 Chronicles 16:8 – Oh, give thanks to the Lord! Call upon His name; make known His deeds among the people!

1 Chronicles 29:13 – Now therefore, our God, we thank You and praise your glorious name.

Ezra 3:11 – And they sang responsively, praising and giving thanks to the Lord: "For He is good, for His mercy endures forever toward Israel." Then all the people shouted with a great shout, when they praised the Lord, because the foundation of the house of the Lord was laid.

Psalm 7:17 – I will praise the Lord according to His righteousness, and will sing praise to the name of the Lord Most High.

Psalm 13:6 - I will sing to the Lord, because He has dealt bountifully with me.

Psalm 26:7 – That I may proclaim with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all Your wondrous works.

Psalm 30:4 – Sing praise to the Lord, you saints of His, and give thanks at the remembrance of His holy name.

Psalm 30:11&12 – You have turned for me my mourning into dancing; You have put off my sackcloth and clothed me with gladness, to the end that my glory may sing praise to You and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks to You forever.

Psalm 35:18 – I will give You thanks in the great assembly; I will praise You among many people.

I hope you will enjoy this Thanksgiving activity! You could also place all the cards or leaves on your Thanksgiving table.


Thank you so much for your encouragement and support these past few months! I have appreciated your cards, prayers, and offers of assistance so very much! I am truly grateful for my church family!


