### Introducing Our New General Presbyter, Rev. Jeromey Howard

(Edited from the Presbytery of Wyoming newsletter)



We are excited and blessed to introduce Jeromev Howard as our new General Presbyter for the Presbytery of Wyoming! Jeromey grew up in Oklahoma and graduated Oklahoma from State University. Jeromey then

served in the US Air Force for 7 years where he had a distinguished career.

While stationed at Warren Air Force Base, he became active as a member of First Presbyterian Church and felt a call to ministry. He eventually came under the care of the Presbytery of Wyoming.

He attended Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, GA. Jeromey was the Theological Student Advisory Delegate to the General Assembly in 2014 on behalf of Columbia Theological Seminary.

After graduating from Columbia, he served as a solo pastor in Richmond, MO, for two years, before moving to rural New York where he has been serving two small congregations.

Jeromey brings a strong background in leadership abilities and experience and has a pastoral heart for congregational and Presbyterian life. He has served extensively in his former and current presbyteries; Committee on Ministry, Church Order and Listening Committee Chair, and Congregational Communications Committee. Jeromey also serves our denomination as a member of the Mission Agency Board and the Advisory Committee on Social Witness Policy. In New York, Jeromey also volunteered as a chaplain/firefighter with his local fire department.

Jeromey wrote, "I want to take a moment to extend my deep gratitude, honor, and excitement about being called to be the next General Presbytery for the Presbytery of Wyoming...I know that I have a lot to learn about from each and every one of you and I look forward to that. I know the realities of the church bring with it moments of great joy and fulfillment...and some challenges and disappointments. I hope to hear about them all! 
### Fall Bible Study


Mission Ministry has two messages for you this month: First, we thank you for your generous gifts to the Pentecost Offering on June 5; and second, we hope you will consider

a gift to the Peace and Global Witness Offering on October 1. In each case, we are addressing very real needs in our area and around the world.

**<u>Pentecost Offering</u>**: As of the deadline for this newsletter, we have received \$1,751 for this offering, which, in general, goes toward helping children. When we match the amount you gave with Irmgard Meyer's money, we have \$3502, so we will send 40%, \$1400.80, to Boys & Girls Club here in Cheyenne and the remaining 60%, \$2101.20, to PC(USA) to help children around the world. This result is a great example of what can happen when we combine our resources, each of us giving what we can. Thank you for your help!

**Peace and Global Witness Offering:** On October 1, we will observe World Communion Sunday, and, as is very fitting for this time, take up the offering which reminds us that we are called to work for God's peace in the world and to 'walk the talk' of our faith whenever possible. This time, we will donate 25% of the offering to a local effort, send 25% to Presbytery for similar work in our region, and forward the remaining 50% to the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and fair treatment of all. Let us pray that this offering will bring help and healing in our area as well as around the world.

As always, our church will match the total we donate, so every dollar you donate will be doubled, up to a total of \$2,000 for the congregation. In other words, your donations could help us provide up to \$500 to a local effort like last year when we donated to Family Promise and Unaccompanied Students Initiative. Presbytery will help with similar efforts in other parts of the state, and worldwide, we could be helping to stop such heinous acts as human trafficking. In other words, right here in Cheyenne, Wyoming, we have the power to make life better for others!

 Living Water, John 4:10, "Agua Viva"

Since 2006, over 70 of our congregation members (and two pastors!) have brought the message of "living water" and developing safe drinking water in needy countries with Living Water International (<u>https://</u>water.cc). In September 2022, eight of

us traveled to the western Dominican Republic and repaired supply systems in the villages of Los Arroyos and Clavellina.

The Mission Ministry is looking to sponsor women and men for a 2024 trip who are able, <u>have a passport</u>, and who want to assist those struggling with inadequate water supplies and hygiene.

Living Water International has just released their destinations calendar for 2024. Central America trips are on for Honduras, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Mexico, and Dominican Republic/Haiti (Caribbean). ### Should We Force Our Children to Go to Church?

Force is such a strong word, isn't it? When I think of force, in the Biblical sense, I automatically think of Samson, who stood between two pillars and pushed an entire building down!

In the parenting sense, of course, we would much rather build our kids up than tear them down. That is why I'd rather refer to forcing our kids to do something as lovingly requiring them to do things that are best for them. And that includes going to church.

Think about it this way: We require our kids to go to school so they can learn and expand their knowledge. We require them to brush their teeth, so they won't get cavities. We require them to be respectful in hopes they will grow up to be respectable members of society. So, why wouldn't we require them to go to church? No matter what our kids' ages or stages, it's important for them to attend church with the family.

When our kids question the importance of going to church, we can offer an explanation similar to this Crosswalk Devotional entitled, "Take Your Child to Church." In it, the author says, "Life isn't lived in isolation. A church provides a bigger family, a group of people to care about and who care for you."

In essence, church provides a connectedness that other groups cannot. Sport's teams and after-school clubs are educational and fun, but they don't provide the deeper heart-connections the church provides. Not only do we want our kids to connect with the family of God, we want them to connect with Jesus, Himself!

I am so excited for all the fun and new events we have planned for the next YEAR! I hope you and your


